## PSY 220 Human Development and Learning ( 4 credits)

This course covers developmental psychology from birth through adolescence with a focus on intellectual and psychosocial behavior and the role of parents and teachers in fostering learning and development. Special emphasis is placed on the topics of readiness to learn and learning theory.
Pre-requisite: PSY 100 Co-requisite: PSY 201 Field experience in Teaching and Learning

EDU 201 Field experience in Teaching and Learning (1 credit)
This is a service-learning experience for students who are enrolled in PSY 222 Human Development and Learning. Through structured experiences in a variety of community settings, students will have the opportunity to examine their beliefs and attitudes about working with children from differing backgrounds, ability levels, and developmental levels.
