Program Admission Requirements:

WCC uses a competitive admission process for high demand programs in health care. WCC offers this LPN to RN program option every Fall semester for LPNs who have successfully completed the admission requirements for this program and prerequisites for NUR 134. Please see the application packet for the number of seats available each term. There are multiple requirements that must be completed prior to submitting an application for admission. Applicants are required to meet all admission criteria and will be ranked based on a point system. The best qualified applicants will be selected for admission to the program. Student residency will be a weighted factor in the process.
