Physical Therapist Assistants (PTAs) are skilled and licensed health care providers who work under the direction and supervision of physical therapists. PTAs perform components of physical therapy plan of care developed by a supervising physical therapist. PTAs assist physical therapists in providing services that help improve mobility, relieve pain, and prevent or limit permanent disabilities for people of all ages who have medical problems or other health-related concerns. Duties of the PTA include assisting the physical therapist in implementing treatment programs, providing interventions, and communicating with the physical therapist and other members of the health care team regarding the client's response to treatment and interventions. Clients may include accident victims, individuals with disabling conditions, and those requiring instruction in health promotion and wellness activities. Rationale for proposed changes: 1. We are discontinuing the requirement for the ROLL course since it seems to no longer exist. Plus, many students now having much more experience with online learning. I have also updated the language to just be "LMS system" instead of stating Blackboard since WCC may move away from Blackboard in the future and there will be enough to update. 2. Reinstating the clinical observation requirements – at this point in COVID, institutions are allowing extra people into their healthcare environment for observation if one is not already enrolled in healthcare education program. We have spoken to the members on our Advisory Committee and they are on board with reinstating the hours. Research also indicates that observation hours familiarize potential applicants with the field which may prepare students better for clinical rotations during the program. Also, after researching the other seven (7) PTA programs in the state, three (3) programs are requiring observation hours, two (2) are requiring an entrance exam. If we reinstate the hours, then 6/8 programs will have some element to assist in student selection to try to strengthen student success. In the field of physical therapy, clinical education internships are still a hardship on the clinic and this is an extra burden to place on clinics. The full-time faculty within the PTA program at WCC decided to decrease the number of hours and number of clinical sites required from pre-COVID requirements.
