## Rationale for proposed changes:

The Certified Alcohol and Drug counselor credential requires applicants to complete 300 hours of education training. 180 of those hours are specific to substance use disorder and are satisfied by the original four courses offered with the certificate. Students also need an additional 120 hours "related to the IC&RC/ADC domains"). For students interested in pursuing the credential, it make sense to offer a certificate that covers all but 6 hours of those 300 hours of education. Each 3 credit class we offer is worth 45 hours of time. By requiring 9 credits, in addition to the 4 substance specific courses, we satisfy 114 of those 120 hours. (Note: 6 of the 120 remaining hours must be a very specific ethics training that

Therefore, it is being requested that these four classes be combined to create an Addiction Studies Certificate, but the requirement that it be post-associates be dropped.
