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### **Graduate Degree Requirements**

The MA in Communication requires students to complete the following:

- Early in their graduate work, prepare an official program of study in consultation with an assigned graduate advisor.
- Successfully meet all conditions stipulated upon entry into the program; and
- Complete, with an overall GPA of at least 3.0, a minimum of 30 hours of approved course work as identified in the official program of study.

The required 30 hours are to be distributed among the 12 credit hours of 500-level courses taken as undergraduate students and the courses listed below.

- 1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. Both institutions agree to accept transferable courses from each other and from other regionally accredited institutions. WCC courses indicated with an \* are required for EMU's BA+MA in Communication. Substitutions for these courses must be approved by the EMU program coordinator.
- 2. Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" experience, and a "Writing Intensive" course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be transferred to EMU.

  To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as applied to transfer students. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform their advisors or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general

education program. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at EMU after

- 3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to either institution.
- 4. Students must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher for admission into the BA + MA program.
- 5. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 48-52 credit hours must be completed in EMU courses, with at least 15 hours in the program at the 300-level or above, and 30 hours of graduate level coursework. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, a minimum of 10 credit hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 142 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
- 6. Students must satisfy all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to EMU, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. WCC students will receive equal consideration with other students for course registration and financial aid.
- 7. Students transferring over with 90 hours will need to take 34 credit hours in their fourth year, to include 15 hours of graduate level coursework
- 8. Students will apply to the MA portion of the program once they have achieved at least 90 credit hours with a minimum GPA of 3.0
- 9. All undergraduate financial aid should be exhausted prior to being admitted to the graduate portion of the BA + MA program. Once admitted to the MA portion, students can apply for graduate financial aid and graduate assistantships
- 10. If a student decides to not complete the MA portion, they will change their major back to Communication and will need a completed minor in order to graduate. Graduate courses taken as an undergraduate will appear on the undergraduate transcript, and will count towards the 120 credit hours needed to graduate.
- 11. Graduate courses taken as an undergraduate student can only be applied to an EMU graduate degree if a student is enrolled in the BA + MA program

### Effective Date: March 1, 2025 until February 28, 2028.

This agreement is consistent with the 2024-2025 catalog. Students have until summer 2032 to graduate from Eastern Michigan University following this agreement. In the event that a student does not complete the program within seven years, they may be required to have their credits reevaluated using the requirements of the current articulation guide.
